Staff want all pupils to be able to tell an adult if something is wrong or worrying them.


























In Trinity Fields we want you to be kept safe from words ar actions that may harm you.

you may see or hear something that upsets you.




You must be very careful and check with staff if you are not sure.



3. keep you safe at school, home and in the community.




Staff will:
