Phase 2 of the Roof refurbishment update

Once again, I would like to extend my sincerest thanks to parents/carers/pupils for their patience and support as we continue to navigate the challenges of phase 2 of the school refurbishment programme. The first section of the roof replacement is now almost complete and will be handed over to us on 2 dates:

- 6th June Maple and Hazel class will move into their new classrooms along with some relocation of administrative and intervention staff
- 7th July Bluebell and Tulip will move into their new classrooms

Please note, until the 7th July, we will have limited extra rooms available for meetings etc...Thank you so much for your patience.

Over the summer holiday period, the school will have its main kitchen completely replaced and made fit for the future. The roof programme will also continue at speed and the final snags will be completed on the new extension. The final completion date for the entire roof and where we will return to 'normal operations' is the 9th March 2026.
